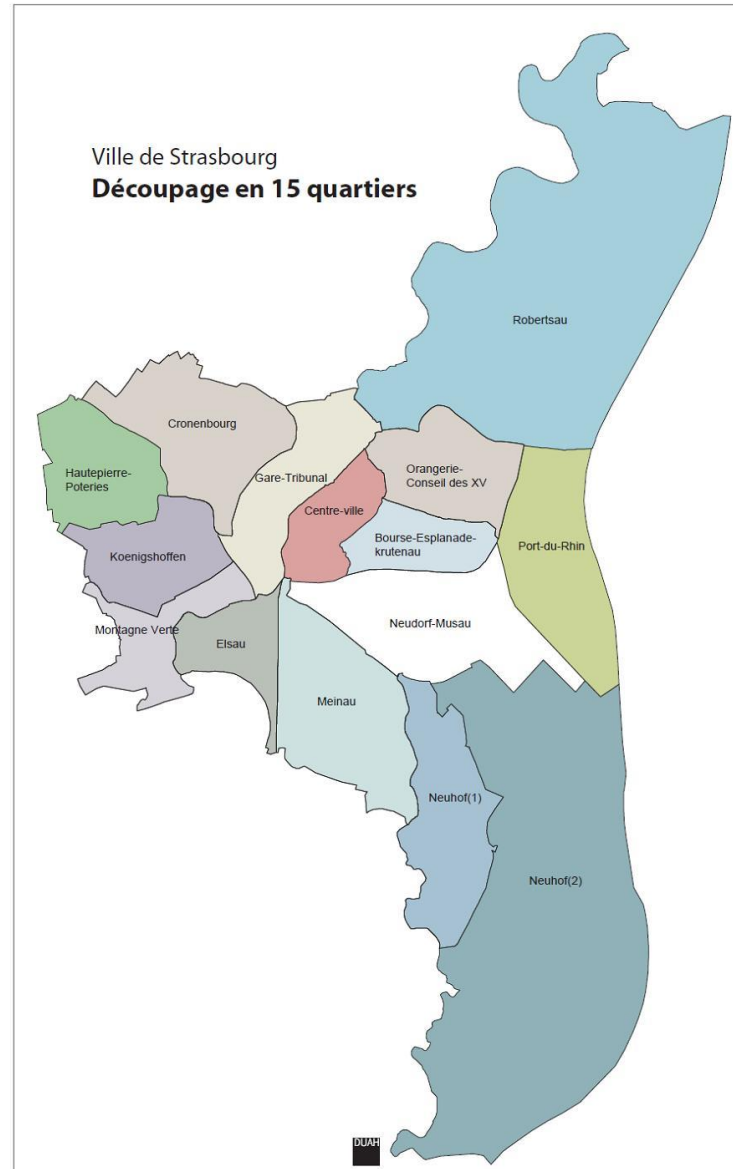

Areas to look for an accommodation outside the city center

This map shows the tram stations near to which we suggest you to find an accommodation. The tram stations are marked in yellow.

It also shows the time you need to go to EM Strasbourg (tram station « Observatoire »)



Areas to look for an accommodation in Strasbourg outside the city center

There are several areas in Strasbourg to look for an accommodation.

- Neighborhoods near the center of Strasbourg, 25 to 50 minutes by public transport or bicycle to get to EM Strasbourg:
 - Meinau
 - Start of Koenigshoffen
 - Rotonde
 - Cronenbourg
 - Schiltigheim
 - Along the tram line
 - Along “route de Bischwiller” and “avenue du Général de Gaulle”
 - City center
 - Hoenheim - access by train (10 minutes to Strasbourg Station) and bus
 - Bischheim - access by train (6 minutes to Strasbourg Station) and bus

Areas to look for an accommodation in Strasbourg outside the city center

There are several areas in Strasbourg to look for an accommodation.

- Towns near Strasbourg, served by public transport and by train.
Count around 40min - 1h to get to EM Strasbourg.
Prices between 300€ and 500€/month:
 - Mundolsheim
Access by train (6 minutes to the Strasbourg train station) and bus
 - Vendenheim
Access by train (9 minutes to the Strasbourg train station) and bus
- (* Trains to and from Mundolsheim and Vendenheim are included in the Strasbourg tram pass fee. No extra fees needed.*
