DIGITAL TOOLS

ERNEST

Ernest, the University of Strasbourg's digital working environment, is both an **intranet** and an internal social network open to members of the university community.

Access: via https://ernest.unistra.fr

ERNEST access was activated when you enrolled for your Bachelor's degree, so that you can submit your supporting documents online.

If you have not registered online, go to "Activate my account (Unistra)" in the top right-hand corner of the home page.

Keep your login and e-mail address safe!

In the event of loss/modification of your password of , consult the section. "Guided assistance/I have a problem with my Unistra account/I have lost my password password" on the support.unistra.fr website.

The administration and teaching staff will only use this method of communication on a very regular basis to send you important information (changes to the timetable, teaching meetings).

You are required to check your e-mail regularly during and after your training (creation of an alias after graduation).





This access code is valid for life after joining the association.




THE SAFE ROOM

The "Safe Place" is a collaborative and caring space, located in room B122 and accessible at all times by our students to:

- Recharge your batteries (particularly during periods of stress, exams, etc....)
- Find information on student wellbeing:

a collaborative library for consulting wor on :

- Mental, sexual and emotional health
- Sexist and sexual violence
- Addiction
- Stress management
- Find self-service risk-reduction equipment (condoms, breathalysers, earplugs, etc.), measuring cups, etc.) or sanitary pads.
- Exchange ideas freely and get people talking: this venue will regularly host themed discussion groups.



THE STUDENT CENTRE



SCHOOL CERTIFICATES WITHDRAWAL OF DIPLOMA

Once your administrative enrolment has been validated, you can edit and print school certificates throughout the year via the ENT, in the My Account/School Certificates section.

You will receive your diploma at the graduation ceremony generally in March of the year following your graduation.

If you are unable to attend the ceremony, you (or a third party to whom you have given a written power of attorney together with a copy of your identity card) may collect your diploma directly from the Registrar's Office or send a request by post/email, stating the address to which you would like the School to send your diploma (by recorded delivery letter with acknowledgement of receipt).

STUDENT CARD - CAMPUS PASS

Student identity card

Students will be able to upload their photo to apply for their card.

The card application procedure is hosted directly on Pass Campus :

The card is given to you when you first enrol. When you re-enrol in the ^{2nd} and ^{3rd} years, you will be given a sticker to stick on your student card.

What is the Carte Culture?

This is a cultural scheme **that automatically** benefits all students who have paid the **CVEC** and those who have not.

IZLY ACCOUNT

Your campus pass is equipped with the **izly** solution, secure and 100% connected, it includes **contactless payment**, can be recharged online and contains a host of services:

- payment for meals in Crous restaurants and cafeterias,
- contactless payment possible on vending machines bearing the izly logo,
- payment in the laundries managed by the Crous de Strasbourg
- borrow books from all Alsatian university libraries,
- access to sporting activities.

To use this contactless payment solution and access the izly.<u>fr</u> website, you must have activated your izly account.

This izly account will be created when you receive your campus pass and an activation email will be sent to your EM Strasbourg address.

- Recycle paper in the bins provided in all the halls.


If you have any problems, please contact the school reception on the ^{1st} floor of Building B.
